Findings from Afrobarometer Round 9 survey in Kenya and the New Government




At a glance



- Most Kenyans think the country is going in the wrong direction
- Most Kenyans think their living conditions are bad/fairly bad in the past year as a good number either fall within the moderate or low lived poverty lines
- The government is generally performing very badly in managing the economy, creating jobs, narrowing the income gap, keeping prices stable, and improving the poor's living standards
- What is there for Kenyans in the new government Bottom Up Economic model?
- The voting pattern in 2022 general elections could be a pointer to the hopes created by the Hustler's narrative


Direction of the country: going in the right direction | Kenya | 2011-2021



Respondents were asked: Let's start with your general view about the current direction of our country. Some people might think the country is going in the wrong direction. Others may feel it is going in the right direction. 
Direction of the country | by age, gender, and ruralurban location | Kenya | 2021



Respondents were asked: Would you say that the country is going in the wrong direction or going in the right direction? (% who say "right direction" or "wrong direction")




Assessment of country's economic condition | Kenya | 2005-2021

Examining country's economic conditions in past 12 months and prospects in next 12 months | Kenya | 2021




Respondents were asked:

Prospects for better economic conditions for the country in 12 months | by gender, education, and age | Kenya | 2021




Respondents were asked:

Looking ahead, do you expect economic conditions in this country to be better or worse in 12 months' time? (% who say "better" or "much better")




Assessment of own present living conditions | Kenya | 2005-2021



Respondents were asked: In general, how would you describe your own present living conditions?




Going without basic necessities in the past year | Kenya | 2021


Personal experience of poverty: Lived Poverty Index (LPI) | Kenya | 2016 - 2021


Government handling of issues | Kenya | 2021

- Most Kenyans either live within the low or moderate lived poverty lines
- Poor rating of the government in handling economic issues

- Election outcome was a revolt against the government
- Most Kenyans New Dawn and High Expectations of the new government.
